Junior Camp/Quad Illness Policy

For the health and safety of all children in our care, we are temporarily changing our illness policy due to COVID-19. Please keep your child home in the event of illness. We recommend that you arrange back-up care prior to needing it.

- Anyone age 5 and older will be required to wear a mask on Quad property. Masks shall cover the nose and mouth snuggly & completely, be disposed of or washed daily. Mask fees may be assessed if children do not bring one.
- If an individual has a fever, cough, or shortness of breath and has not been around anyone who has been diagnosed with COVID-19, they should stay home and away from others until 72 hours after the fever is gone and symptoms get better.
- If we have a confirmed case of COVID-19, the classroom in which the child attended would be closed for 14 days, all children and staff in that classroom would need to self-quarantine for 14 days.
- Since the center is unable to provide the one-on-one care a sick child requires, in addition to our concern for the health and wellness of other children; we require that the child be removed from the center within the hour.
- Return to the center may require medical clearance.
 However, the center may require that in addition to a return to care slip, the minimum policy guidelines found below must also be met.

Subject to change depending on the CDC, DCF or Quad's regulations or policies.

| A child must be excluded from the center if displaying the following symptoms: | A child may return to the center when the following has been met: |
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| A temperature of 100.4° or higher | When the child is fever-free for 72 hours <u>without the aid of a fever reducer</u> such as Tylenol, Ibuprofen etc. |
| Three incidents of diarrhea within a day or <u>24 hour period</u> | When the child is free of diarrhea for 72 hours and has returned to a normal diet. |
| Vomiting | When the child is free of vomiting for 72 hours and has returned to a normal diet |
| Inflammation of, or discharge from the eye | The child with eye infections &/or discharge may return after 72 hours of antibiotic treatment <u>and</u> symptoms have improved. This includes but is not limited to pink eye/conjunctivitis. |
| An unusual rash | The policy for returning after a rash depends on the cause of the rash. |
| Any known or <u>suspected</u> communicable disease (measles, chicken pox, pink eye, lice, ringworm or roseola) | The policy for returning depends on the communicable disease. See Wisconsin communicable disease guidelines for child care centers for more information. |
