Lomira Junior Camp Quad

QuadCare's Lomira Junior Camp Quad program is produced and hosted by Quad's Wisconsin-licensed QuadCare center in Lomira. With our flexible schedule, competitive rates and convenient location just off Highway 41, we offer plenty of engaging daytime activities for your school-age children while also meeting your needs as a parent. We also offer special field trip days to further stimulate developing minds.

Who can attend Lomira Junior Camp Quad?

We accept children from ages 5 through 12. The children of Quad employees and members of the surrounding community are eligible to enroll.

When does the program start and end?

Lomira Junior Camp Quad runs June 8 to August 28, 2026. If you need care outside of these dates, call us so we can help you. We are open from 6:00 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Where is the camp located?

Lomira Junior Camp Quad is held at Quad's Lomira plant in the childcare center.

The address is N11896 Hwy. 175.

How do I enroll my child?

Visit Quad.com/quadcare for a registration packet or call 920-269-5500. Tours of our center are available upon request.

Is there a registration deadline?

We can accept registration forms as long as we have room in our program. However, no child may start until their registration has been processed and the child's file is up to date. Space is limited.

How will I know if my child has been accepted into the program?

Confirmation of acceptance will be made via email or by phone (or, in some cases, in person for Quad employees who are registering on-site at Quad's Lomira plant). In the event of incomplete registrations, you will be notified and asked to submit missing requirements before enrollment is confirmed.

How much does it cost?

The following schedule outlines camp costs.

Full day rate (up to 10 fixed hours) 2nd child discount	Quad employees/second child discount \$38.20/\$34.40
	Community families/second child discount \$41.30/\$37.20
Extended day rate (over 10 hours)	Quad employees/second child discount \$45.60/\$41.05
	Community families/second child discount \$48.30/\$43.50

Families with children that attend camp for 4 hours or less per day will pay an hourly rate of \$7.60 for the first child and \$6.85 for each additional child. Hourly rate does not include meals.

Registration and tuition

Referral credits

Referral credit: Refer a new family and receive a \$50 credit when they enroll. The referring family's name must be listed on the new family's registration form.

Teacher referral credit: Refer an ECE teacher to the Center and receive a \$100 credit if they are hired. Just have them send their resume to Nikki Sharp at nsharp@quad.com.

Registration fee

Early Bird Registration Fee

- Until May 15, 2026, registration fee will be \$50 first child and \$10 each additional child. Fee will be billed to the account.
- After May 15, 2026, the registration fee moves to \$75 first child and \$10 each additional child. Fee will be billed to the account.

All forms must be fully completed and returned in order to enroll in Lomira Junior Camp Quad, along with a \$100 per child Field trip, Snack and Activity fee.

Tuition requirements

- Keep your balance current. You pay only for the days your child attends and for any extra fees incurred.
- Quad families must have a Dependent Care Flexible Spending Account and/or current payroll deduction in place that will cover the cost of all child care. Payroll deduction forms are included in your packet and must be turned in to QuadCare (not Human Resources) with your registration paperwork.
- Community families must pay in advance for services. QuadCare accepts W-2 assistance.
- Payments can be dropped off at camp or the child care center, or they can be mailed directly to the Accounting Department at Quad/Graphics (N61W23044 Harry's Way, Sussex, WI 53089). Please include your child's ID number in the memo area of your checks.

What fees are not included in the tuition?

How does billing work?

- Quad sends out invoices on a biweekly basis. Because you are billed only for the costs you incur, billing takes place after care has been provided. Please estimate your cost when prepaying.
- If a balance is rolled into the next month, a \$50 fee will be charged to the account.
- For Quad employees, Dependent Care Flexible Spending Plans run through the end of the year; after-tax deductions for summer camp end after the last summer billing cycle. In the event you still owe money, you must make arrangements with the Accounting Department to bring your balance to zero. In the event of an overpayment, arrangements can be made with Accounting for reimbursement.
- Employees not using the employee flexible spending plan are expected to pre-pay weekly. After two occurrences of missed payments, an after tax deduction will be required to continue enrollment in the program.
- Community families pay in advance by estimating their cost and submitting payment. Accounting will adjust billing statements accordingly. Balances must remain current to continue care.
- All returning registrants must have a zero balance before re-enrollment into the program is confirmed.

Please make sure your child(ren) are logged into Lillio upon arrival.

Discipline

The safety and well-being of the children in our care is our priority. Therefore, we've established the following guidelines for discipline.

- In most cases, Lomira Junior Camp Quad will use a progressive discipline approach. We also give them the opportunity to self correct their behavior before involving the parent.
- Children are expected to display appropriate behavior and use appropriate language while attending camp. Children are expected to treat teachers, peers and property in a respectful manner. Inappropriate physical behavior, language (including the use of threats, profanity, or discussing inappropriate content), poor attitude and disrespecting people and property will result in the following consequences:
 - Verbal warning to the child and explanation of warning.
 - Loss of privileges and review of expectations.
- Staff and child will document behavior and consequences, and staff will contact parents. Consequences will be enforced. Parent may be asked for a personal conference with staff and/or camp director to discuss a plan for corrective action.
- Violent behavior causing harm to staff, peers or property or repeated disruptive/inappropriate behavior may result in immediate, temporary suspension and/or expulsion to be determined on a case-by-case basis.
- A Disciplinary Agreement may be included as part of the enrollment process.
- Medical conditions will not be accepted as justification for unacceptable behavior when behavioral conditions are not disclosed on Health History Forms.
- If the child's behavior does not improve, a parent/staff conference will be requested and the child's enrollment in the camp program maybe terminated.
- Failure by a parent to respond to and/or acknowledge disciplinary concerns, including failure to disclose conditions that affect behavior, may also result in the child being dismissed from the program. It is not our intent to label or judge any child. Our goal is to be made aware of conditions which can prepare us to help each child's experience at camp be as successful and positive as possible.

Field trips

QuadCare is eager to find a variety of field trip destinations for our program to enjoy.

How do I pay for field trips?

A \$100 per child fee is due at time of registration. Fee covers all field trips, snacks and fun activities.

What do I need to know about field trip days?

- We ask that your child(ren) arrive at least 30 minutes before the bus departure time to get prepared for the field trip with program t-shirts, sunscreen/bug spray and an opportunity to use the restroom before loading students onto the bus.
- Shoes with socks and a water bottle are required for field trips days.
- Electronics are allowed to be used during bus traveling times. Any belongs brought onto the bus will be the child's responsibility. QuadCare will not be liable for loss or broken electronics/belongings.
- Field trips may get canceled due to weather.

What if I arrive late or have to leave early on a field trip day?

These situations will be handled on a case-by-case basis. If you know you will be late or need to leave early, please let us know in advance so that we can work with you and attempt to accommodate your needs. If we are unable to accommodate your schedule, you may need to make alternate arrangements for the day. Lomira Junior Camp Quad teachers will not be left behind to provide one-on-one care.

How can I contact the group when they are out on a field trip?

The group travels with a Center cell phone. If you need to contact them for any reason, the phone number is **920-583-5238**. We will have all the parent contacts loaded on the cell phone. Please add our number in so you know if you are receiving a call from a Junior Camp Quad teacher.

What is expected of my child when they are on a field trip?

Children are expected to stay with the group and be respectful to others and the field trip environment we are enjoying. Children need to follow directions, use appropriate language, and make safe choices. Everyone needs to follow the bus rules while traveling to and from our field trips. The benefits of group cooperation include peer support, shared responsibility, patience and group goals. Failure to follow our field trip guidelines and safety procedures will result in child removal from outings.

If a child repeatedly has potty accidents while on field trips, staff will reevaluate child's ability to regulate bladder control aligned with going on field trips. Children are offered bathroom breaks anytime while on field trip site and before loading onto the bus to travel, but the bus can not stop for bathroom breaks once moving to the next destination.

Summer School

QuadCare has established busing to and from Lomira School District for Summer School.

How does Summer School work with Lomira Junior Camp Quad?

- Mark on your schedule calendar form if your child will be attending the five weeks of Summer School through Lomira School District.
- Fill out the transportation form if your child will be busing to and/or from QuadCare for Lomira Summer School.
- Breakfast will be served from 6:45–7:15 a.m. for students getting on the bus for Summer School.
- Bus pick up time is at 7:30 a.m.
- Bus arrival time is at 12:15 p.m.
- Summer School participants will miss the hot lunch served at the Center, so they will need to bring a cold lunch for the days they will be returning to the Center after Summer School. Please make sure all food brought in for lunches are **nut-free** items.
