# Sussex/Pewaukee Junior Camp Quad

It's where kids go to build character, practice integrity, learn the value of friendship and have fun!

## The Basics

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### Who can attend Junior Camp Quad?

Children must be at least 5 years old and have **completed five-year-old kindergarten**. The maximum age is 14.

We welcome children from the community and employees' families, including those with special needs, as long as we can safely and appropriately support them without compromising the well-being of any child or staff member. However, our staffing ratios do not allow for one -to-one care.

### When does camp run?

Camp starts Thursday, June 15, and runs through August 28, 2026. Care after August 28 will be offered at the Sussex Center. A note of this should be made on your schedule. Quad Care will not offer care prior to June 15th. Please arrange for other care prior to June 15.

We are licensed from 6 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. on Monday through Friday to accommodate our production schedules. However, many classrooms close by 6 p.m. See director for more details. We also close at 6pm on Fridays unless arrangements are made in advance with the director.

### Where is the camp located?

Junior Camp Quad is held in the Quad Care facility just across the street from Quad's Pewaukee plant on W224 N3297 Duplainville Road.

### How much does camp cost?

The following schedule outlines camp costs.

### Are meals included?

Lunch is included in the daily rate, and is \$3.75 for anyone on the hourly rate. Supper is \$3.75.

### How much do field trips cost?

Trip costs are listed in the brochure. Trip fees are supplemented by fundraisers, billed to your account and will be found in your billing statement. Field trips are our most popular days and are scheduled on a first come first served basis. Once bus capacity is reached, additional kids can be put on a waiting list. With enough attendance, a second bus can be ordered..

### How do I enroll my child?

### What is the registration deadline?

We will continue to accept registrations as long as we have room in our program. However, registrations received after May 15 may not be processed in time to begin on your desired start date. Registrations that are filled out in entirety will receive a \$25 discount per family. (Check your instruction sheet for instructions on filling out forms). Space is limited so enroll soon!

### How will I know if my child has been accepted into camp?

Confirmation of acceptance will be made via email, in person or by phone. In the event of an incomplete registration, you will be notified and asked to submit missing requirements before enrollment is confirmed.

## Payment arrangements

- We require a non-refundable registration fee upon enrolling your child. Enrollment will not be confirmed until registration fee is received.
- Camp paperwork is audited by camp staff before being reviewed by the Wisconsin Department of Children and Families and must be fully completed. We request that paperwork be completed and turned in for processing a few weeks prior to the first day of camp. Incomplete paperwork requiring multiple audits will be assessed a fee of \$25.
- Each family that enrolls is required to submit a payment agreement.
- We only bill you for the days your child attends. However, you may be billed if your child is scheduled for an advance event that a vendor scheduled/billed and your child does not attend.
- We ask an average of 2 days per week commitment, however, it is not required.

**Pre-week and post-week enrollment (critical scheduling)** is reserved for those families who are enrolled in the program and attend on a regular basis through the summer. Families scheduled, but not attending on a regular basis may not be allowed to attend during critical scheduling weeks (pre-week and post-weeks).

- We offer flexible scheduling to accommodate for summer school and other commitments. Please ask for details.
- Junior Camp Quad tuition is eligible for dependent flexible spending reimbursement.
- Anyone not using the employee flexible spending plan must pay in advance either by credit card, check, a state funded program or through another flexible spending plan. **A late fee will be assessed if prepayment is not received** and care may be suspended until payment is made.
- Some families with past credit history may be asked to make payment in full prior to enrollment acceptance.
- Current pretax dollars can only be used for childcare tuition incurred during the current calendar year.
- Camp fees can be payroll deducted for Quad employees.

## Our awesome staff!

- All Jr. Camp Quad staff members meet or exceed those requirements set by the state of Wisconsin Department of Children and Families Early Care and Education Division.
- Staff members are required to participate in regular staff meetings and in-service trainings.
- Jr. Camp Quad staff are mandated reporters for child abuse and neglect as required by the State of Wisconsin Department of Children and Families.
- Many staff members are returning counselors; some were even campers at one time!



# A typical day

We pack our days full of fun, whether we're heading out on a field trip or spending the day at base camp. Here is what your camper can expect.

## Field Trip Day

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We offer field trips each week except pre- and post-weeks. **All campers participate in field trip activities; exceptions must be cleared with camp director prior to trip.** Spending money is acceptable on some trips but should be limited to a **few cash dollars.** Our counselors will help campers understand the value of their money. Because field trip days are our most popular days, campers are scheduled on a first-come first-served basis. Once we have reached bus capacity, campers will be put on a waiting list. Depending on total attendance, a second bus may be ordered, or a counselor may stay at base camp with the extra campers. However, we will not leave a counselor at base camp for one child.

<b>6:00–8:00 a.m.</b>	Arrivals, attendance, morning snack, games, trip preparation! Apply sunscreen, pack lunches and grab IDs.
<b>8:00–8:30/9 a.m.</b>	Hold our group meeting, take last-minute bathroom breaks and we're ready to go!
<b>8:30/9:00 a.m.– 3:30/4:00 p.m.</b>	Field trip fun! Possible trip snack <i>Some days will have a later return time as events open later in the day</i>
<b>3:00/4:00–6:00 p.m.*</b>	Return from field trip, post-trip snack, free choice activities, departures.
<b>6:00–6:30 p.m.</b>	Dinner
<b>6:30–7:30 p.m.</b>	Free choice activities, departures

## Base Camp Day

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Aside from typical summertime fun — jump rope, hula hoops, tag, kickball and the like — we'll have activities for all kinds of interests.

<b>9:00–11:30 a.m.</b>	Group meeting, activities/projects based on the day's or week's theme, outdoor play
<b>11:30 a.m.–1:00 p.m.</b>	Lunch, quiet activities
<b>1:00–2:30 p.m.</b>	Outdoor play
<b>2:30–3:15 p.m.</b>	Snack, quiet activities
<b>3:15–6:00 p.m.*</b>	Free choice activities, departures
<b>6:00–6:30 p.m.</b>	Dinner
<b>6:30–7:30 p.m.</b>	Free choice activities, departures

# Summer's Here~Game On!

## Camp Rocks

Campers play a major role in shaping our summer program – after all, it is their summer. This year, they've chosen a Summer of Games! ## Book Swap/Journaling

Before the Free Little Library came the Book Swap. Since books inspired our Game Theme, and reading is important, we will continue our Book Swap for 2026. Kids will be able to bring a book, take a book (just like a free library). We will also provide materials and prompts for journaling. We will use our down time to either read or create a Gratitude Journal. As we travel through new and exciting books and stories and, our imaginations can only grow, expand and level up right along with us!

## I Should Have Known That

Once again, we'll be turning some of our transitional moments into mini game sessions designed to boost problem solving and critical thinking skills. The ability to interpret, evaluate, and analyze information—and then make thoughtful decisions—isn't just important, it's a core building block for strong communication and self regulation. Campers will dive into fun, hands on games that introduce these skills in playful ways, all while learning how to think creatively and "outside the box."

## Level Up!

This year, our campers came up with an exciting game idea: LEVEL UP! Just like in the gaming world, they'll have countless opportunities to level up all summer long. By stepping up their game – whether during activities, clean-up time, spirit days or even acts of kindness, campers can earn bonus rewards and power ups throughout the season.

## Boot Camp

Campers have also created their own action packed Boot Camp—a "get up and move" series of challenges perfect for those rainy day, stuck inside moments. It's a true pick up game experience, where campers design the activity, tweak the rules, and launch the fun themselves. Every round can be different, but every challenge is camper powered, and the energy never stops.

## Spirit/Theme Days

Spirit/Theme Days will alternate throughout each week to

give everyone a chance to join the fun and show off their camp pride. Campers and counselors will choose the spirit/themes and announcements will be posted on the parent board and in Lillio.
